2 Now you see it, Now you don't

So we do not focus on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. 2 Corinthians 4:18

The next section that I would like to discuss still focuses our attention on God and Creation. I call this section "Now you see it, Now you don't". With no pun intended this portion was eye opening and jaw dropping as I saw the wisdom that was revealed. Here we go.





In the physical world that we wake up to everyday, there is much to see if we look around. If we go outside, we will probably first notice the light and the sky. We have the sun by day and moon by night. We have the sky and the stars. If we venture out, we can see the majestic mountains with its rocky peaks, its snow & ice, its landscape trees and many animals. We can go to the beach and see the white/dark sandy beaches and the ocean and birds and fish and palm trees. In the city we see buildings and houses and cars and machines and people. We can see a lot if we look around with our physical eyes. But for everything that you can see, there are thousands of things that you can't see. In fact, most of the world that we live in is unseen.

Stay with me here. I will share an example to illustrate my point of the **unseen world**. Most of us have a refrigerator. In your refrigerator you

may find a container of milk. Let's discuss what you see and what you don't see regarding this container of milk.





What you see:

- A plastic/cardboard container
- White liquid
- A top that seals the container
- Writing on the container with information

What you don't see:

- The cow that produced the milk
- The grass that the cow ate
- The water that the cow drank
- The parents of the cow
- The farm that the cow lived on
- The cow's farmer
- The age of the cow
- The treatment of the cow
- The cow's internal organs
- The cow's offspring
- The raw ingredients for the container
- The people who produced the container
- The conditions/place in which the container were produced
- The process of getting the milk from the cow


- The process of getting the milk into the container
- The process of sealing the container
- The people who wrote the information on the container
- The education of the people who provide information
- The accuracy of the information on the container
- The shipping process to get the container to market
- The trucks and trains used in the process
- The people who stocked the containers in the stores
- The temperature that the containers were stored
- The officials in charge of making sure the milk is healthy
- The store owners
- The people who coordinate this entire process



I think that you now see the point that I am trying to make. Even with a simple example of a container of milk, you can see the principle of "What we see and What we don't see". And I have not even attempted to discuss what happens at the sub-atomic levels. How we can't see these little particles (electrons, neutrons, protons...) that make up these larger items that we do see and how their interactions work. This same principle is true for everything that you see and know in life. We as humans are extremely limited in what we can see with just the physical eye. Yet every day we venture out into this vast unseen world with our very limited information pack and try to conduct life. Who would take such a trip without a map or guide? What would happen if we went into the Black Forrest or the Amazon or the Sahara Dessert or the Pacific Ocean without a map or Guide? We would surely wander or maybe perish.

For everything was created by Him, in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities-- all things have been created through Him and for Him.

Colossians 1:16



Only the Supreme Designer can see the things visible and invisible.

Everything in Creation is connected. And only this Designer knows how all of these things interact together because this Designer designed it that way. One of our first steps to growth is understanding our limitations and need for guidance. Without this first step, it is hard to grow because we feel that we are sufficient to lead ourselves. Look around and ask the question, "how's that working for you and the others around you in this world?" We need a Guide and what better Guide to have than the One who created Everything, Who is All Powerful, and Who is Everywhere at All Times.
